God's Kids brings purpose and hope to the lives of orphaned children worldwide by:


- * Providing quality nutrition, clean places to live, and medical care for orphans

Not only did he guide and direct our orphanages to be as transparent and accountable as possible, but he often spent time in the field making sure the kids were taken care of in loving and caring ways.





After our visit in 2014, we made many small improvements to infrastructure at our orphanage in India during 2015 including new water/sewer lines, new ceilings, and repairs to the outer walls. In May, the God's Kids board approved funding to purchase land next to the orphanage in India, creating a safe area for the children to play. Swings, see-saws and a slide were constructed for the children to use in the play area. It was completed in September 2015.






In May 2015, Liberia was officially declared Ebola free after the outbreak in 2014. This year, we have started to focus our support in Liberia onto REAP, a non-profit in Liberia that helps orphans and students with agricultural and medical provision. During 2015, we helped REAP create new bathrooms in 3 communities, we plan to continue creating these bathrooms with REAP for additional Liberian communities in need.

During 2015, with your help the God's Kids board purchased land for two new feeding centers in Mazatlan. The first one opened at the end of the year. Once complete, each center will feed 40-60 children twice a day.

Our orphanage in Tijuana has made substantial updates per new government regulations including new safety signage, new doors, and additional insulation in the rooms.

Julia, our nurse friend, visited the homes in Bohol during the summer of 2015. The children had health and wellness checkups; she also taught the orphanage parents how to take medical notes and records for each child. We also

started building two water wells on the property to allow for fresh water to be available on the site.

A Life Saved

Roldan is a teenage boy who has lived at Village of Hope, Philippines, for the last 13 years.

He had a severely damaged heart valves as well as fluid in his lungs. Both of these maladies would have killed him if left untreated.

Through your support, God's Kids was able to get Roldan heart surgery and he has been recovering very well.







Julia also visited our orphanage in Thailand in the summer of 2015. She also set up medical records for the children during her stay. While there, she set up an immunization schedule for the children and even had shots administered by nearby doctors. At the end of 2015, we purchased seven strollers for children in a nearby village who were unable to walk.
