


OUR PASSION & PHILOSOPHY


God's Kids brings purpose and hope to the lives of orphaned children worldwide by:



Bringing the light of God's love takes many forms.

This year at Mercy's Children's
Home of India, that love took
the form of renewable electricity.
The home needed an independent
power supply to allow the children
to read, do homework, and enjoy their
evenings together. We provided several
solar panels to make this possible.



A hallmark of God's Kids Orphanages' worldwide efforts is improved education and life skills development. In February, we provided tuition for the fall and spring semesters for the 26 children who live at Mercy Children's Home. We also sent funding for new uniforms and school supplies. Additionally, Deepak the orphanage leader was able to purchase four new computers, including three laptops, and is using the new equipment to train the children in computer skills and technology. As is customary before the school year begins, all the children were immunized, dewormed, and underwent medical checkups — and everyone is healthy!

Another goal of God's Kids is to help raise adults who will create a positive impact in their community. Four children aged-out of the home this year; nevertheless, we will continue to fund their education for two more semesters.



A cornerstone of God's Kids' worldwide effort is the development of children's life skills and vocational aptitude.

REAP (Restoration of Educational Advancement Programs) is one of God's Kids' longest and most steadfast partners in the betterment of children's lives. This year, we partnered with REAP to create a sewing program, training the young women of Bentol, Liberia, for careers as seamstresses. Each quarter 10 young women will be trained on five new machines. During the summer 30 young adults completed a 21-day life skills intensive. Chosen from high school graduates from 10 Liberian orphanages, the participants learned carpentry, sewing, and tailoring.

Last fall, God's Kids sponsored the educational efforts of a teenage boy named Charlie, whom we have known for many years. His passion is to become a doctor and care for the many Liberian children with medical needs. He has finished his first year of college and recently started his second year. We have once again funded his education so he can achieve his goal.

Even the REAP leaders strove to improve their skills this year. Dr. Howard Ostendorff, the Africa Director for Freedom in Christ Ministries, visited REAP in a partially God's Kids-funded trip to train REAP's management in Christian leadership values.







Amistad Familiar Someone once said, poverty is a very complicated issue, but feeding a child isn't. The leaders of Amistad Familiar have devoted themselves to the heart of this issue, feeding hundreds of children in the some of the poorest areas of Central Mexico.

In 2015, the God's Kids board approved two new feeding centers to be built in the Mazatlán area. The sites of the two feeding centers were selected and purchased in July 2015. Construction was completed in December 2015 on the first feeding center and the second feeding center was completed in mid-May of 2016. The latest center is located in Escuipina, a suburb of Mazatlán, where Carlos and Marilu hope to continue building additional feeding centers. God's Kids volunteers attended the grand opening celebrations for both feeding centers, the first of which coincided with the children receiving shoebox presents from Operation Christmas Child.

Also during our visit to Amistad Familiar in Mazatlán this past May, we noticed several repairs were needed at the special needs orphanage. We sent funding to fix these problems, which included redoing an upstairs bathroom, replacing a downstairs toilet, and purchasing a new microwave for the orphanage.

Casa Hogar Belen God's Kids is devoted to giving orphans and impoverished children hope for a bright future. This hope is ever-present in the smiling faces of the children at Casa Hogar Belén orphanage in Tijuana, Mexico.

At the behest of the Mexican government, numerous structural, organizational, and operational upgrades have been completed this year. All of the original 23 renovation projects, except the relocation of the propane storage tank, have been completed.

Among those improvements were: the school supplies are now organized and stored until needed; safety signs and fire extinguishers have been installed throughout the property; and a new dental and medical center has been built on-site for when doctors visit the children. Throughout the year, God's Kids volunteers inspected the facilities semi-monthly and delivered fresh meat and produce, rarities in the children's diets due to the extra expense. Overall, the children remain happy and healthy.



At the Village of Hope in Bohol, Philippines, health, home, and education were on the improvement agenda in 2016.

Dental hygiene was a key improvement area for this year. Namely, we wanted to see the children brushing their teeth every day. The VOH team created a fun chart the children to get into the daily habit of brushing their teeth.

Also this year, the Philippines public school system tuition requirements changed to include both 11th and 12th grade as part of the schooling process for children. These final two years are devoted to vocational training, and to helping find jobs for the children when they graduate. Currently we now have 14 students in elementary, 11 students in high school, and 8 students in college/trade schools. We have funded all of these children's tuition costs for the 2016-2017 school year. We also helped fund the education of two staff members as they get Master's degrees in counseling and social work that they may learn to care for the children better.

Roldan Update Village of Hope orphan Roldan was diagnosed with heart disease and underwent emergency heart surgery in August 2015. He is still undergoing rehabilitation, performing exercises to make his heart and lungs stronger and working to reduce his INR levels (how thin his blood should be). Roldan turned 20 on January 26th and they celebrated at the hospital.

Roldan recently returned to his home church, where he stayed last June before his disease resurfaced. He was given a chance to share his testimony. He shared for 20 minutes about the miracles of the Lord in his life. Everyone is moved by God's grace for Roldan. We are in the process of finding a local cardiologist, medication supplier, and lab for Roldan's ongoing medical and recovery needs.



As the old saying goes, it's easier to build strong children than repair broken adults. God's Kids' mission in Thailand finds us building both physical and intellectual strength in the children under our care.

Sharon Porterfield, our partner in Thailand, informed us about a few children in need of medical attention. One of whom was young girl who needed to have surgery, which included a chemically innduced coma, to correct swelling in her head. She is healing in the children's ward at the local hospital. Matthew, a boy who lives near our orphanage, lost his arms and legs to a landmine. God's Kids has covered the ongoing doctor visits and prosthetics expenses for Matthew and his family.

Last year, another organization blessed Huaymalai with a new girls' dorm. Then they remodeled the old dorm to allow the boys to have a better living space. They recently completed renovations on the ceiling and it looks great! In addition to the ceiling improvements, three large water storage tanks were purchased so water will not need to be carried up a large slope each day to the girl's dorm.

In early April, we funded school tuition, uniform, and school supply costs for 13 orphans we take care of in Thailand. In June, we helped fund 3 of our orphans who have started their studies college/trade schools. Joseph, wants to become a doctor for the migrants on the Burma border; brother and sister, Pat and Paul, want to become a nurse and police officer, respectively.
